

Comptroller and Auditor General: Code of Data Matching Practice – Response to Consultation

November 2018

Introduction

- Under statutory provisions inserted in the Audit and Accountability (Northern Ireland) Order 2003 ("the Order") by the Serious Crime Act 2007, the Comptroller and Auditor General (C&AG) was given the power to undertake data matching exercises for the purpose of assisting in the prevention and detection of fraud.
- 2. Under article 4G of the Order the C&AG must prepare, and keep under review, a code of practice with respect to data matching exercises ("the Code"). Regard must be had to the Code in conducting and participating in any such exercise.
- 3. Article 4G of the Order provides that before preparing or altering the Code, the C&AG must consult the bodies mentioned in Article 4B(2) of the Order (which are those bodies whose accounts are required to be audited by the C&AG or by a local government auditor), the Information Commissioner and such other bodies or persons as he thinks fit.

The Existing Code

- 6. The existing Code was published in July 2008, following consultation with a range of stakeholders (as defined in the Order) and the Information Commissioner. The Code had become out-of-date and required review and updating.
- 7. The draft Code issued for consultation included the following key changes from the 2008 Code:
 - The consultation draft Code reflected developments in how data matching exercises are conducted, and the introduction of new data matching products (for example, paragraphs 1.2.4 and 2.11.1).
 - The consultation draft Code excluded references to obsolete legislation, in particular the Data Protection Act 1998. References are now to "data protection legislation", with appropriate links provided to the Data Protection Act 2018 and the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) (for example, paragraphs 1.6.2 and 2.1.4).
 - The consultation draft Code reflected changes to organisation's names; in particular, all references to the Audit Commission are now to the Cabinet Office (for example, paragraph 2.3.4).
 - The consultation draft Code included multiple references and links to new guidance on data protection from the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) (for example, paragraphs 2.8.1 and 2.8.2).
 - The consultation draft Code included additional comprehensive guidance on the requirement for fair and lawful processing and the need for privacy notices (formerly fair processing notices) (see Section 2.8).
 - The consultation draft Code included additional guidance on data security and data breaches, with appropriate links to relevant ICO guidance (see Section 2.10).
 - The consultation draft Code included updated guidance on individuals' rights under the new data protection legislation (see Section 2.16).

8. The consultation exercise is outlined at paragraphs 9 to 14. Paragraphs 15 to 16 give a summary of the types of issues raised by consultees and paragraph 17 outlines the changes to the consultation draft Code as a result of the consultation exercise.

The Consultation Exercise

- 9. The consultation draft Code of Data Matching Practice was issued on 14th August 2018 via email to the organisations listed at **Appendix 1**. The majority of these organisations participate in the C&AG's data matching exercises carried out under the National Fraud Initiative (NFI). The response date for the consultation was 1st October 2018.
- 10. The consultation draft Code was also made available on the Northern Ireland Audit Office website (at https://www.niauditoffice.gov.uk/national-fraud-initative).
- 11. Eleven responses to the consultation were received, from:

- 12. Five of the responses provided substantive comments on the draft Code; six expressed contentment with the draft as issued.
- 13. The majority of substantive comments were received from the Information Commissioner's Office. Many of these related to providing clarification of terminology and additional links to data protection legislation and guidance on the Information Commissioner's website.
- 14. In addition to producing this document, we have given detailed responses to those organisations which provided substantive comments.

Issues Raised

- 15. Key issues raised during the consultation related to:
 - changes to data protection legislation;
 - the application of the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR);
 - the content of privacy notices;
 - the data collected;
 - data security and links to guidance on data breaches; and
 - the rights of data subjects.
- 16. All comments provided were given due consideration and the consultation draft Code was amended where appropriate. Changes are set out in more detail below.

Amendments as a result of the consultation

17. The following table summarises the changes made to the consultation draft Code as a result of the consultation exercise. Paragraph numbers refer to the updated version of the Code as published.

2.8.6	Final clause of final sentence amended to "unless it would involve a disproportionate effort or proves impossible", to reflect the position under revised data protection legislation.

2.10.2(f)	Link to ICO guidance on data security breaches added. Additional wording included to reflect the need for organisations to follow internal procedures and notify their data protection officer regarding any data security breaches.	
2.10.5	Wording added to distinguish data processor and data controller.	
2.10.6	The words "where feasible" removed in relation to notifying data breaches. Links added to relevant ICO guidance and legislation.
